

1. Introduction

The Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) for the academic year 2021–2022 was conducted at

N. P. Arts and Commerce College, Keshod to evaluate the effectiveness of the teaching-

learning process and to assess students' academic experiences. Feedback was obtained

from students across various programs, including B.A., B.Com., M.A., and M.Com.,

through a structured questionnaire designed in accordance with the NAAC guidelines. A

total of 300 **students** participated in the survey.

2. Methodology

The feedback was collected using a standard questionnaire recommended by the NAAC

framework, comprising 20 quality-based parameters focused on curriculum delivery,

faculty performance, institutional support, and learning outcomes. Responses were

recorded on a four-point scale. The data was then compiled, statistically analyzed, and

interpreted to identify key strengths and areas requiring improvement.

3. Analysis of Student Feedback


The key insights from the survey responses are summarized below. Each question is

followed by a visual (pie chart) that represents the percentage of responses for better clarity.



1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?




2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?






4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as








15. The institution engages students in teaching-learning process improvement.




16. The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.







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4. Action Taken Report

Based on the detailed analysis of student feedback collected through the SSS for the academic session 2021–2022, the college has identified both areas of strength and areas needing further enhancement. The following actions were taken by the institution to address students' concerns and to improve the overall quality of the teaching-learning environment:

1. Enhancement of Teaching Quality:

Teachers were encouraged to adopt more interactive, student-centric teaching methodologies, including participative learning, group discussions, and real-life case studies. Internal faculty meetings emphasized the integration of innovative pedagogy to meet diverse learner needs.

2. Strengthening ICT Usage:

In response to student suggestions on improving digital delivery, the use of ICT tools like smart boards, projectors, and subject-related multimedia content was further promoted. Faculty received orientation on using advanced digital tools for classroom teaching.

3. Improved Academic Support and Mentoring:

The mentoring process was restructured to ensure regular follow-up and academic guidance. Mentors were advised to maintain a record of interactions and provide personalized support to students in academic and personal matters.

4. Transparent Evaluation Practices:

Teachers were instructed to ensure transparency and fairness in internal evaluations. Answer sheets and assignments were discussed in class, and students were given constructive feedback for improvement.

5. Promotion of Experiential and Practical Learning:

Departments were encouraged to organize more field visits, surveys, and project-based learning activities. These initiatives were taken to bridge the gap between theory and practice.

6. Soft Skills and Employability Enhancement:

Value-added courses and soft skill development sessions were introduced. Training programs focusing on communication skills, interview techniques, and personality development were arranged in collaboration with the placement cell.

7. Encouragement of Extracurricular Engagement:

Students were actively involved in cultural, NSS, NCC, and sports activities. Teachers provided support and motivation for student participation, thereby enhancing their overall college experience.

8. Curriculum Outcome Awareness:

Teachers were instructed to share course objectives and learning outcomes clearly at the beginning of each semester. Outcome-based education practices were emphasized in staff training sessions.

2. Methodology


